




**The Next Town Hall Meeting is:

This summer, a team of ten Masters students in the University of Maryland's planning program will be doing a summer research project related to the "Community Wellness Zone" proposal contained in the Port Towns Sector Plan. The purpose of the wellness zone is to sustain healthy eating and active living. The students will be researching best practices in supporting active living in places similar to the Port Towns, and will be exploring current conditions in the Port Towns related to access to healthy, affordable food, walk-ability, bike-ability and recreational opportunities. ATTENTION DOG OWNERS:

There have been many complaints about pet waste left around Town. Please be courteous and responsible when walking your pet. Clean up and dispose of their waste properly. Carry a bag with you. Cottage City has an ordinance for owners who don't "scoop the poop." (Chapter 1, 1-9 - Solid Animal Waste) The penalty for violation is \$50 for each initial offense and \$100 for each repeat offense. Your cooperation is appreciated.

CHILD SAFETY

As warm weather is here and the kids are out of school, your children are spending more time outdoors. This is an appropriate time to think more about child safety. Teach your children to be traffic smart with these safety tips:

- Cross the street with an adult or older friend.
- Cross at intersections at the traffic light.
- Use the crosswalk and watch for cars.
- Stop at the curb. Look left, right, left, over your shoulder.
- Let ongoing traffic pass.
- Make eye contact with drivers.


